Year 3	Ted Hughes the Iron DAHL TRUMP PIXIE	The Tron Man — A classic text, with rich vocabulary which matches Year 3 writing targets (similes). The big book is to enhance their experience through the beautiful illustrations. The truth Pixie — Focusses on kindness and the importance of celebrating differences. Linked to
