## Key Learning

Areas of Development	
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	- Children can find compromise without adults intervening Children can talk about what they can do well and what they need to get better at.
Communication and Language	- Children can listen and do for a short period of time Children are beginning to understand humour including rhymes and jokes Children can use their imagination to make roles in their play.

Maths  Maths	<ul> <li>Children can subitise amounts to 5. For example, spotting an amount without counting "I can see 3 trees and I did not need to count them".</li> <li>Children can recognise the different ways to make a number e.g. "I can see 5 with a 3 and 2 or a 4 and 1".</li> </ul>
Understanding the World	<ul> <li>Children know that other children do not enjoy the same things and are sensitive to this.</li> <li>Children to talk about the features of their own environment and understand how different environments may vary from one another.</li> </ul>
Expressive Arts & Design	<ul> <li>Children can respond imaginatively to arts forms and objects.</li> <li>Children can play cooperatively as part of a group to create, develop and act out an imaginary idea or narrative.</li> <li>Children to share their creations and explain the process of how they were made.</li> </ul>
Themes covered	At the end of last term, we looked at the theme of Christmas and explored different activities relating to this. The children made salt dough decorations, Christmas cards and Christmas wreaths.  We also looked at the story of the Gingerbread Man and the theme of pirates! The children loved building their own pirate ships, designing their own pirate treasure maps and creating treasure chests to find.  This term we have started by getting to know our new Hedgehog teacher Mr Thomas and learned all about an exciting story called 'Lets all Creep through in Crocodile Creek'.
