

Things to keep in mind...

To act out stories.

To recognise Spring 1 Phase 3 sounds and tricky words. To read simple captions and sentences.

Phonic sounds to be taught – ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er words with double letters. To begin to write simple captions and sentences. To understand that sentences start with a capital

letter and end with a full stop.

To spell words using taught sounds.

To spell some taught tricky words correctly.
