

# Primary School PE & Sport Premium Report (2024–2025)

In the 2024–2025 academic year, the school received a total of £19,440 in PE and Sport Premium funding, with no carry-over from the previous year. The entire allocation was strategically invested to enhance physical education, promote active lifestyles, and ensure inclusive access to sport for all pupils.

### **Key Spending Areas**

- **Staff CPD**: £1,392 was allocated to external training, enhancing staff confidence and competence in delivering high-quality PE.
- Internal Activities: The majority of the funding (£17,348.46) supported extra-curricular clubs, top-up swimming lessons, new equipment, and educational platforms.
- **External Activities**: £699.54 was used to engage pupils in inter-school competitions and the School Games organiser network.

### **Targeted Support**

Focused initiatives were implemented to increase participation among:

- SEND and medically vulnerable pupils
- Girls, through leadership and peer-led activities
- **Disadvantaged pupils**, via subsidised clubs and community links

#### **Impact**

- Staff reported improved skills and confidence in PE delivery.
- Pupils showed increased engagement in physical activity and competitive sport, with broader access and a raised profile of PE across the school.
- **Swimming outcomes** for Year 6 showed 75% could swim 25m, while 55% could use a range of strokes and perform safe self-rescue.

#### Sustainability

Investments in staff development and resources are expected to have a lasting impact, supporting the long-term delivery of a high-quality PE curriculum.
