Personal, Social and Emotional Development

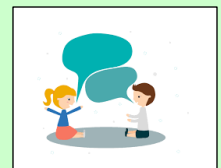


Begin to form positive relationships with adults and peers.

Use the toilet and manage hand washing independently.

To recognise different emotions

Communication and Language



To listen and respond to ideas expressed by others in conversation or discussion.

To understand why listening is important

To be able to follow simple directions

To be confident to talk in front of a small group.

Physical Development

To be confident in showing a preference for a dominant hand.



To play running and chasing games safely, negotiating spaces, changing speed and direction to avoid obstacles.

Mathematics

To recognise numbers 0-5

To subitise to 3.

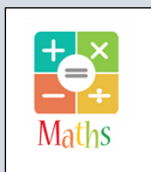
To count forwards and backwards within 5.

To tag each object with 1 number word when counting a group of up to 5.

To group objects and representations

To compare small groups identifying which has more and less.

To identify when groups have equal amounts.
Count forwards and backwards within 5.



Expressive Arts and Design

To use a wide range of construction materials, e.g. joining pieces, stacking vertically and horizontally, balancing, making enclosures and creating spaces.

To name colours and experiment with mixing colours.

To create simple representations of people and objects with drawing and painting tools.

To explore different techniques for joining materials

To recite a range of songs and rhymes.

To experiment with different instruments and their sounds.



Literacy

To use pictures to tell stories.

To sequence familiar stories.

To independently look at book,

holding them the correct way and turning pages

To recognise their name.



Phonic sounds to be taught - **s a t p i n m d g o c k c k e u r h b g l** Tricky words **is the I**

To write some of the letters in their name.

To give meanings to the marks they make.

To copy taught letters.

To write initial sounds.

Key text – Peace at last

Understanding the World

To talk about events they have experienced.

To talk about how they have changed since being a baby.

To know about family structures and talk about who is part of their family.

To identify similarities and differences between themselves and peers.

To know about and recognise the signs of Autumn.

To ask questions about the natural environment.

To use ICT hardware to interact with age appropriate computer software
