The Value that we are focusing on this term is:

Ambition

Understanding the World

To compare and contrast characters from stories, including figures from the past.

To recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

To know about and recognise the signs of Summer.

To know some important processes and changes in the natural world including states of matter e.g. melting, floating and sinking.

To compare different environments (linked to journeys).

Physical Development

To test out my ideas when I experiment with different ways of moving to reduce risk.

To push, pat, throw, catch and kick a range of objects with increasing control (to a peer/adult or target).

Communication and Language

To follow a story without pictures or props.

Extend vocabulary, especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.

To develop the confidence to talk to other adults they see regularly around the school.

Mathematics

To know some numbers bonds to 10

To subitise beyond 5 in irregular patterns.

To recognise numbers 0-20.

To represent numbers 1-20 in different ways.

To begin to use time to sequence events.

To count to 25.

To combine groups to find a total (within 10).

To begin to take away (within 10).

To recognise and make simple patterns.

To recognise and make more complex patterns.

Things to keep in mind...

- Long hair should be tied back during the school day.
- Earrings need to be small studs and need to be taken out for PE days (Tuesdays)
- We do ask that children bring in water to drink whilst in the classroom and they can bring juice for lunchtime if they wish.
- Please make sure that you write into your children's reading journal when you read at home.

Literacy

To begin to answer questions about what they have read.

To use vocabulary that is influenced by their experiences of books.

To recognise Summer 1 Phase 4 sounds and Tricky words

To read simple sentences containing taught sounds.

To form most lowercase letters correctly and begin to former capital letters.

To begin to use capital letters at the start of a sentence.

To spell some taught tricky words correctly.

To begin to read their work back.

To be confident in expressing own wants, needs, interests and opinions in a familiar group.

To have a good understanding of the need for safety, and can manage small risks when tackling new challenges.
